- \$21.3 Million Revenue
- \$20.0 Million Expense
- •\$ 1.3 Million Net Income
- Net Income \$1.0 Million Better than Budget
  - Due to HA5 savings, \$150K;
  - Salaries and Benefits, \$388K unfilled positions;
  - Depreciation, \$156K capital timing later in Year;
  - Portico Donation \$148K;
  - High volume property transfers \$75K
  - Tank Installations \$44K

# 2019 Capital Program Summary

- Toqua Golf Clubhouse
- Kahite Community Center
- Wellness Center Dehumidifier
- 21 Other Projects; Avg. \$29K

\$2.38 M; \$ 23K Under Budget

- \$ 701 K; \$80K Under Budget
- \$ 281K; \$ 4K Over Budget
- \$ 608K; \$ 16K Under Budget
- Total Capital Plan \$4.68 M authorized; \$20K Under Budget
- NOTE: Wellness Center Roof as approved was \$309K over budget for a longer-lived metal roof and additional interior repairs. This project carried over \$305K into the 2020 Capital Plan.




