

#### FANTASTIC FACTS ABOUT MONROE COUNTY

The following facts are not listed in order of importance or fascination. In fact, they are not organized at all!

- 1) Since its founding in 1819 Monroe County has grown to over 46,000 people making it the 6<sup>th</sup> largest county in TN. 21.4% of the population is over 65 years old.
- 2) Monroe County has the distinction of being home to a state park, a national forest, and a TVA dam.
- 3) Incorporated cities in Monroe County are Madisonville, the county seat; Sweetwater; Tellico Plains; and Vonore. Other villages include Etowah, Coker Creek, and the Kahite Neighborhood of Tellico Village, nicknamed "the little town with the big backyard".
- 4) Tellico Plains became the first gold rush site in 1831 when gold was discovered near Cocoa Creek.
- 5) The Lost Sea located in Sweetwater is the world's largest underground lake. If you have not visited the blind fish, you have not lived.
- 6) The Civil War Trail that divided the North and South touches all the cities in Monroe County.
- 7) The capitals of three Cherokee Nations were in Monroe County Tahlequah, Tanasi, and Chota. Sound familiar?
- 8) When three Cherokee chiefs traveled to England with Alexander Cummings to meet the king, the king gave one of the chiefs a pair of reading glasses. The chief ordered that he be buried in his canoe with the glasses. Much later his canoe was discovered with the glasses in it. Do not ask if they were on his skull!
- 9) The three chiefs took a crown to the king of England. Was it made of gold? Jewels? No, possum!
- 10) Monroe County has had four courthouses 2 were destroyed by fire, one of those during the Civil War; one was torn down when the county outgrew the available space; and the present building that was completed in 1897. The current courthouse, an attractive building, is listed in the National Register of Historic Places.
- 11) Since the current courthouse was designed with offices for the tax collector, the assessor, and other officials, the first floor has several walk-in safes, one of which is now the mayor's office.

- 12) The 54-mile Cherohala Skyway that connects Tellico Plains and Robbinsville, NC runs through 1,024 acres of mountains, rivers, 18 hiking paths, lakes, and breathtaking curves.
- 13) Monroe County is home to the oldest health department in TN, a department that resides in the only existing structure built by the Civilian Conservation Corps.
- 14) Charles Hall started the first telephone company in Tellico Plains. His museum, located on the Cherohala Skyway, contains a fascinating collection of artifacts gathered by Charles and his wife Billie Neil.
- 15) In 1947 Allen Benton turned his talent for creating mouth-watering country ham and bacon into Benton Smoky Mountain Country Hams. The company located on Highway 411 in Madisonville is known worldwide and ships internationally.
