President's Message





Recently one of your Tellico Village neighbors was a victim of theft - I want to share the generic version of the story as an eye opener to everyone and provide you with important tips and preventative measures to keep you and your loved ones safe.

Mr. Neighbor kept a couple of firearms in his nightstand drawer. Since the grandkids were coming for the holidays, he thought it would be safer to move those guns to an area of the closet out of reach. Grandkids came and went and in the days following Mr. Neighbor had a service repair person out to his home. Just so happens that service repair person had to access the master closet to complete the repair. (You all know where this story is going...) Sometime later, Mr. Neighbor remembered "Oh, I should put my guns back in my nightstand since the grandkids are gone now..." However, the handguns were nowhere to be found in the master closet.

Election Update

The county primary elections will be held on May 3, 2022. This is the election where our local officials get selected (since there is rarely a Democratic challenger), so it's really important for everyone to participate. A few key dates to think about:

- You have until February 2 April 26 to request an absentee ballot.
- You have until February 17 to submit your petition if you want to run for office.
- April 4 is the deadline to register to vote in the primary (note: you can't vote absentee in the first election you participate in).

In Loudon County the Sheriff, County Clerk, Register of Deeds, Superintendent of Roads, County Commission District 1A and 1B are all contested. There may be additional candidates since the application window has not yet closed.

In Monroe County we have not yet heard who has petitioned to run for the open positions.

TENNESSEE SMART YARDS (TNSY) PROGRAM

Once upon a time, Tellico Village was a forest and no negative pollutants entered the water. Today with urbanization and 5K plus homes, nutrients like nitrogen (NI) and phosphorous (Ph) are being carried by rain water into the lake. These chemicals promote plant growth to your lawn and flower beds and they promote the growth of green smelly algae and unwanted vegetation at the lake shore. To protect the long-term water quality of the lake and the real estate value of our homes, each one of us needs to become a steward of the lake and take preventative action NOW to protect the water quality of the lake.

GOOD SHEPHERD CENTER PRODUCTIVITY BENEFITS FROM TCF GRANT

Productivity at the Good Shepherd Center (GSC) in Madisonville improved dramatically thanks to a grant from the Tellico Community Foundation (TCF). The grant was used to purchase six laptop computers, scanners and food pantry management software.

Recently, TCF made an \$8,000 grant, its largest cash grant in the foundation's short history, to the GSC. The newly purchased technology has transformed the organization.

"Most all of our tedious, manual intensify processes have been effectively streamlined," says Tina Smith, GSC Executive Director. "Before we had our laptops, we were tracking and trying to manage the center by producing reams of paper records."
