The theme for this month is Open Village Meetings! Our HOA goal is for all villagers to "Be Engaged. Be Informed. Be Heard" and this is a series of opportunities to do just that.

HOA is presenting 3 Open Village Meetings in the next few weeks:

1. On March 31 we are sponsoring the POA Long Range Planning Advisory Committee (LRPAC) at the Tellico Village Community Church. LRPAC will be presenting the results of an extensive

survey of all village property owners which they completed last fall. You may have seen highlights of the survey results in various meetings. This presentation is to provide a wider and deeper look at the results. Similar to the last survey in 2019, we expect the results of this survey to impact the future planning of our village. The presentation will include time for a Q&A session, so bring your questions and comments.

- 2. On April 7 we are holding a candidates' forum for Loudon County at the Tellico Village Community Church. The focus will be on the Sheriff and Road Superintendent positions to ensure we have sufficient time for a good debate. The HOA Highway Safety Committee and Neighborhood Watch are helping the HOA Board to come up with questions to ask. We hope to have a good discussion with the candidates that will help all of us to be informed voters. There will be an open Q&A session at the event.
- 3. On April 18 we are holding a candidate's forum for Monroe County at the Kahite Community Center. We have invited the candidates for Sheriff, County Commissioner 4th District, and County Mayor to attend. Similar to the Loudon County OVM, we're currently working on questions to ask the candidates and an open Q&A session is planned.

Our HOA Social on March 8 was a St. Patrick's Day celebration! We had a great turnout and had a lot of fun together. Highlights included a presentation by the Litter Angels, with Annie LaCour explaining the program and holding sign-ups. Also, Jim Dezzutti talked about the great progress that is being made to start up Our Place and he encouraged everyone to participate in the PickleBall Tournament to benefit Our Place on April 28-30. We are currently looking for someone to be the Business Manager of TellicoLife. This is separate from the Technology Manager role and focuses more on the accounting, marketing, long term business strategy, and business process design of TellicoLife. TellicoLife has only been in existence for a few years and is slowly maturing. If you have an interest in this type of work and want to have an impact on the future of TellicoLife as our primary event scheduling tool for the village, please let me know.

DRUG TAKE BACK DAY




On Saturday, April 30^{th,} for the third time, the Tellico Community Foundation (TCF) will sponsor Tellico Village's Drug Take Back Day.

YARD STICK ISSUE 4

Odd/Even Watering: Best Way to Water Your Lawn

A New Approach for 2022 in Tellico Village

Over watering our lawns is harmful to the grass and potentially the lake. The best management practices (BMPs) for watering lawns that are supported by research from the UT's Agricultural Extension Service are:

- 1. Water deeply
- 2. Water your lawn twice a week. If your home address number is odd, water on Tuesday, Thursday, or Saturday. If your home address number is even, water on Monday, Wednesday, or Friday.
- 3. Water between 3 9 a.m.
- 4. Turn off your automatic sprinkler system if it rains one inch (1") or more per week. These four basic watering BMPs are meant to keep your lawn healthy, the lake free of excess chemicals that promote the growth of algae and unwanted vegetation, help balance water pressure in the Village and keep money in your pocket.

It is Election Time in Tellico Village and Loudon County; and we have an abundance of elections in 2022. Coming up soon on 5/3/22 we have the Loudon County Primary Election (LCPE). The results of the LCPE lead directly into the TN Federal/State Primary on 8/4/22. In addition to being the General Election for county positions the 8/4/22 election is the primary for state and federal positions including Governor, US House of Representatives, and TN Senate and House of Representatives. Tellico Village is in the 5th TN Senatorial District and the 21st TN House of Representatives District. Also, in this election residents vote for Lenoir City officials. However, Tellico Village residents do not vote for Lenoir City, Greenback, and Loudon City positions that are a part of the elections. Finally (whew) we have the Federal/State General Election on 11/8/22.
