The updated policy statement that will be voted on at the next HOA Board Meeting is:

1. Children attending must be of an age appropriate to the activity, as determined by the event chair. Parents/guardians, not the HOA, are solely responsible for their children and the children's behavior.
2. Event attendees are limited to HOA members in good standing and their guests.
3. Guests of members may not be residents of Tellico Village.
4. Members of different households that wish to sit together at events such as baseball games or theater shows, must contact the event coordinator for arrangements.
5. Households are made up of persons living at the same address as listed in their Tellico Life profile and should be signed up for events using the "Linked Profile" button on the event registration page.

I'm looking forward to seeing you at future events, and thanks for another wonderful month.

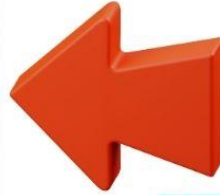

IT'S A SCAM

Be aware!! There have been recent reports of people receiving phone calls from a person claiming to be from your local law enforcement agency. The caller will identify themselves in a manner that leads you to believe they are legitimate and proceed to tell you that you have a warrant for your arrest and that you need to immediately pay a fine in order to clear it from

the system or face being arrested. Some of the more aggressive callers will threaten that they are coming for you. Don't be surprised if they know all your information already also. Whatever you do, don't panic and hang up the phone. These callers are SCAMMERS!!

In no way, shape, or form will the police ever call you and ask for money or tell you that you have a warrant. Don't you watch TV?? They just come for you if that's the case. Or when they come in contact with you next, they arrest you on the spot.

Either way, scammers are becoming more and more sophisticated and aggressive with their tactics. You should NEVER give into and pay someone over the phone for something you can not verify. If you get caught up on one of those calls, just hang up.

Some important things to remember:

- Do NOT ever give out your personal information over the phone like your date of birth or social security number.
- Do NOT give out bank account or credit card account information.
- Do NOT share your passwords.
- NEVER feel pressured or panic. If that's the case, hang up, relax and verify.
- ALWAYS verify before proceeding. That means if you have to call the person or company back, make sure NOT to just call the number the caller gives you. Look up the number on your bill or on the computer and call that number. Tell them you received a call asking for whatever and you need to confirm it was legitimate.

A few extra steps will save you a lot of head ache later if you are victimized.

Once you sign up, you will receive an email (make sure to check your spam folder) letting you know you have been added to your neighborhood Group. Soon after that email, you should also get a welcome email from your specific Neighborhood Watch Coordinator who will introduce themselves and give you all their contact information. After that, the NW emails go out periodically, and you should receive them.

The catchall to get everything started is to just email above with the requested info.

Neighborhood Watch relies on everyone to be the "Eyes and Ears" of Tellico Village.

For non-emergency incidents, contact the Loudon County Sheriff's Department at (865) 458-9081.

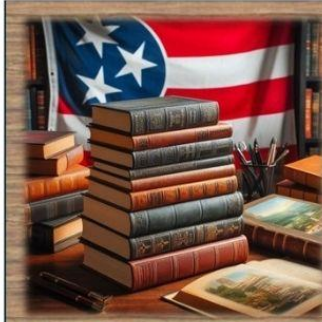

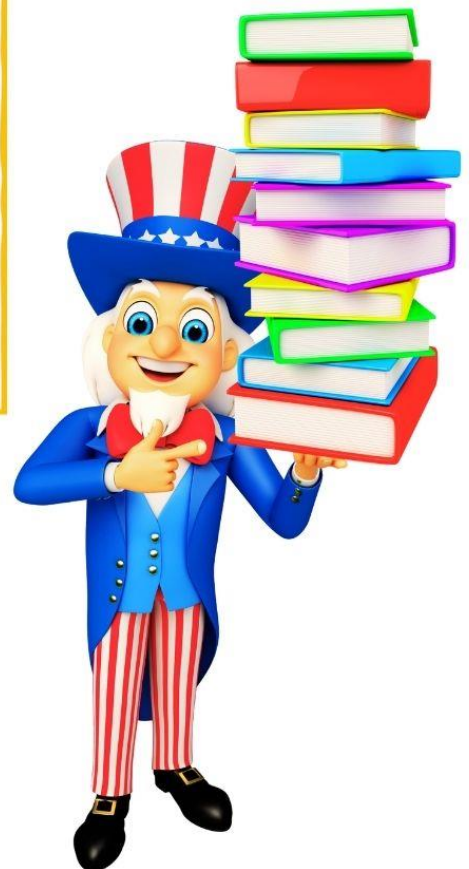
