

Main Lift Station Upgrade and Wastewater Storage Tank



In HOA's ongoing effort to keep our members informed about issues affecting our community, we reached out to representatives of various departments for some straightforward facts about the planned wastewater storage tank. Many thanks to

Phil Brenner, LRPAC - John Tierney, PSAC - Matt Benoit, POA Public Works for taking the time to respond to our specific questions.

Is the wastewater storage tank part of the TAP? Has it always been?

BRENNER (LRPAC) & TIERNEY (PSAC) - Yes, it is part of the TAP program, Project #2. The main lift station upgrade and storage tank was a result of studies over at least the past 5 years, which predates the creation of "TAP". BRENNER (LRPAC) - Wastewater tanks are not uncommon. Knoxville has several. Lexington, KY has at least 2. So does Columbria, SC. Chattanooga constructed one in 2022 (designed by Jacobs Engineering). Nashville uses this approach.

Is it going to hold 750,000 gallons of wastewater?

BRENNER (LRPAC)- YES. I think it is important to recognize that this is an "overflow" tank. Most of the time this tank will have little or no wastewater in it. A handful of times eah year when we have high rainfall events that exceed our ability to pump it, or LUB's ability to accept it, the excess wastewater would flow into this tank for holding. As the rainwater recedes, the stored wastewater would be pumped out to LUB.

TIERNEY (PSAC) - YES.

Will it be located near Tugaloo off of Sequoia?

BRENNER (LRPAC) & TIERNEY (PSAC) - Yes, the existing station is accessed by a driveway off of Sequoia, which is immediately adjacent to the Chota Shores / Tanasi Shores / Yacht Club sign and garden. The project will replace the existing main lift station and be constructed next to the existing station. It will be vital that the existing lift station remains in service until the replacement pump systems and tank have been constructed and tested. All the sewage in the main village is piped to this point.

BRENNER (LRPAC) - I think it is important to recognize that this location is where ALL of the main village's wastewater eventually goes TODAY. There is a wet well there today, so some limited amount of wastewater storage is occurring there today (along with the other four lift stations in the main village).

Will it be visible from Rt. 444?

BRENNER (LRPAC) & TIERNEY (PSAC) - The existing station is visible from 444 if you look hard enough. It is located adjacent to 444 but many feet below the level of the road. The new station and the storage tank will be built further away from 444, necessitating tree clearing and excavation. By slant view, the tank and new station structures will likely be more visible, if looking that way while travelling at 40-50 MPH down the state highway. A similar tank was recently constructed in West Knoxville on Ebenezer Road, North Shore Drive; This tank is down below the road, but visible if you are looking for it.

BRENNER (LRPAC)- I don't know what plans (if any) have been contemplated for shielding the tank from view, but I imagine that landscaping may help. I would also note that in reading a little about these tanks, I came across installations where tanks were disguised to look like something else. Here is one in St. Louis

IMPORTANT ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

BENOIT (POA PUBLIC WORKS) - The floor elevation of the proposd Wastewater Storage Tank is 832 feet. The top of the tank is 859(ish) feet. The road grade elevation of Hwy. 444 854 at the site of the current Main Pumping Station, so the tank will sit approximately 5 feet above the road. With the evergreen trees that are between the site and 444, I don't think much of the tank will be visible from the street. I would only add to some of the commentary about visibility that when traveling down 444 (2-lanes), you must take you eyes off the road to see the existing pump station (provided you know what you are looking for). It is so far below the road grade of 444 that when traveling southbound you have to look way left and down. I'm not sure you can even see it when traveling northbound, because it sits so low.

The closest house to the proposed wastewater storage tank [would] sit about 20-22 feet higher than the top of the tank. Looking at the aerial map of the property, there are solid trees between the proposed Wastewater Storage Tank and the nearest home. Certainly some landscaping could be added to screen the tank.
