 - Scott hopes to minimize any additional expense to relocate the tank through costs savings associated with other TAP projects that continue to move forward.

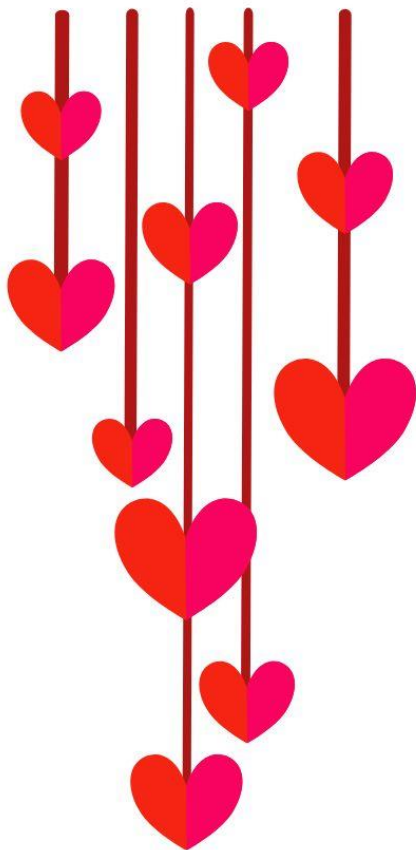

History Highlights 1986 - 2011

- > *Have you ever wondered why there is a POA and an HOA?*
- > *Are you aware of the many amenities Tellico Village offers because of the many Advocacy Initiatives the HOA has petitioned for on behalf of its members concerns?*
- > *Would you like to understand how the mission of the HOA has evolved over the years?*

Please join us over the next few months as we share some of the interesting highlights that we have uncovered in the archives of the Tellico Village Library. See how the culture of volunteerism and camaraderie has created the place we all love to call home, and how the HOA has been instrumental since the very beginning.

IN THE BEGINNING

A Maryville, TN newspaper executive purchased the first lot in Tellico Village in April 1986. He never built a home on it. During the next 2 years, 2,000 lots were purchased. Prices ranged from \$7,000 to \$35,000 or more. Some were merely investments, some were purchased for golf and amenities, and others were planned for "some day" homes.

On Christmas Eve 1987, a party was held in the 6-month-old home of Vince and Paula Matthews. The guests decided to create an organization to be known as "**The Pioneers**," and membership was limited to only those who had built homes in the village during its first year. There were 52 families who joined.

In those days, the operation of Tellico Village was under the direction of a President and a General Manager, both of whom were employed by Cooper Communities, Inc. (CCI) of Bentonville, Arkansas. There was also a Property Owners Association (POA) with a board of 5 employees of CCI who also lived in Arkansas. They came to Tellico once a month for meetings.

Homeowners soon found they had questions about their representation on the POA Board regarding construction and maintenance of roads, cost of financing operations, etc. Don and Pat Kegley, for example were especially interested because they could only access their property by boat, since there were no roads leading to it. At one time, Don's car skidded off narrow Toqua Road and almost landed in the pond near the 10th green of the golf course.

When Sam and Eleanor Lewellyn moved to their new home, they had to carry water from a nearby fire hydrant because there were no water lines. The Richards family had no plumbing, so they used a port-a-John until the sewage system was built.

The residents decided it was time for a meeting of the homeowners.

Hike 'n Lunch

Aspire Park – Clinton, TN
Clinch River Greenway

Thursday, March 6, 2025
Depart Poplar Springs Boat Ramp promptly @ 8:45 AM,
please arrive 10 minutes before departure time

Rating: EASY, mostly paved asphalt trails
Distance: 3.1 miles total (approximate) Elevation gain: 260 ft.

Brief Description of the Hike: We will initiate our hike from the Onward and Upward Building near the main parking lot. We will follow the Clinch River Greenway, a paved asphalt trail, to the northeast, past the Grit'n Bank bicycle skills area and the large playgrounds. We will continue along the shores of the Clinch River before looping back on this same trail. We will return near our starting location before proceeding south to the kayak launch area and through the open prairie trails. These trails are 95% hard surfaced with only a couple of significant hills. The trails we will use represent approximately 10% of the total trail system in this brand new private park which is offered to the public free of charge.

After hiking we will eat inside the "Pearl" restaurant at the "Onward and Upward" center at the Park, no need to even move your car! Dependent on weather conditions we can eat outdoors or inside the restaurant.

Directions to "Aspire Park", 777 Aspire Drive, Clinton, TN 37716
Detailed driving instructions will be given on the morning of the hike.
Note: If you are using Google Maps, input "Aspire, Aspire Dr. Clinton, TN".


Drive time to the park is approximately 45 minutes. Parking is ample and readily available near the Onward and Upward Center building. There are public restrooms inside.

Important note: In the case of inclement weather, we will suggest that the group should plan to come to Aspire Park and "The Pearl" restaurant for a very enjoyable group lunch meeting at 11:30 AM.

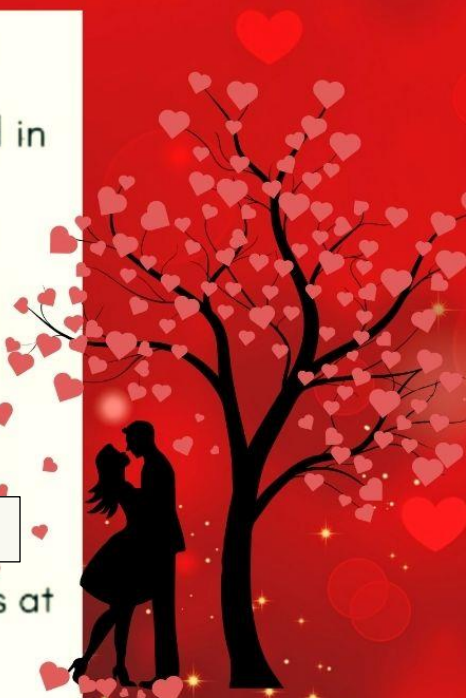
